#### **President's Corner**

November is Presidents Parley and Military Family Month.

What is the President's Parley? The mission of the Past Presidents Parley Committee is to recognize and honor female veterans and to utilize the experience and knowledge of past Auxiliary leaders for the training and encouragement of future Auxiliary leaders.

The Military Family Month is a celebration first established by the Armed Services YMCA in 1996 as a way to honor the sacrifices servicemembers and military families make every single day.

North St Paul Unit 39 American Legion Auxiliary has had a special ongoing project since January 2019. We put together Welcome Home Bins for Veterans who have overcome homelessness through MACV. To date, we have donated **454** Bins for Veterans and their families. That is over 100 bins since this time last year. The Bins contain sheets, pillows, blankets, towels, personal care items, laundry supplies, kitchen supplies, and those extras that are needed when setting up a new home.

Each bin now costs between \$200 to \$250 depending on the needs of each single Veteran or the Veteran with their family members. We have 3 -4 fundraisers a year to pay for the bins and supplies. This year, the number of homeless Veterans has gone down tremendously! Last August our supply was depleted. We reached out for help from our Legionnaires. Post 39 and Gambling gifted us funds to get us back on track. Shortly after, one of our members, Joe Vogel, reached out to his contacts, City and County Credit Union.

This time last year, they gifted us \$24,000, so we can continue our mission! On Monday, October 14, a couple of us got together with the CCCU Impact team and supported them while they went to work putting together another 30 bins! We are excited to partner with this great organization along with MACV. We will continue to put together these bins as we move forward because of their generous donation!

We worked with the Riders and other Legion members over the last four weeks cleaning veteran gravesites at Evergreen Memorial Gardens cemetery. We have 782 veterans on our list for Evergreen and we found that 684 of these needed cleaning and we cleaned all 684 of them. I want to thank the many volunteers who helped get this job done. We have three more opportunities to volunteer.

We will be working with the Riders on two upcoming events. One is regarding a coat drive for homeless veterans on Saturday, November 2 and the other is the Pancake Breakfast on Saturday, December 7. A third opportunity to volunteer is to sell 50/50 tickets at our Post 39 on Sunday, November 17 during the Vikings game. To learn more about these opportunities, please keep reading.

The Fridley American Legion does an annual coat drive for homeless veterans each year. We want to team up with the Riders and get a similar operation going with our own American Legion for this area of the Twin Cities. The program basically involves the Legion buying coats from Goodwill in bulk. The Legion then takes these coats and washes them at a laundromat. They are then packaged and distributed. We plan to start this next year, but to get this going we are going to go along with the Fridley Legion and observe how they execute the operation.

So, what we need this year is to get a couple of SAL members to join this observation party. Tom Nagel will be one and we would like to have another one or two SAL members go as well. This event will take place this Saturday, November 2. This will take the entire day. We will meet at the Fridley American Legion at 9:00 AM and then head to the Goodwill Outlet in Brooklyn Park. There we will purchase coats in bulk. From there we will then spend the afternoon taking the coats to be washed and whatever other processing is done with them before distribution. Once this process is observed, we will then begin to set up a similar process for our Legion to execute in 2025. Please let Tom Nagel know if you are interested in this event. Another opportunity will be on Sunday, November 17 at our American Legion during the Vikings game. We will sell 50/50 tickets during the game with a drawing after the game's conclusion. The game starts at noon and should end around 3:00 or so. There are two ways to help with this event. We have three cash raffles weekly here at Post 39.
